## Pathway For FRCEM and MBA

- Training delivered in India and UK on the basis of RCEM curriculum leading to MRCEM.
- Candidates enrolled for MBA in Healthcare & Leadership from USW.

### India/Overseas

#### Year 1

- Clinical training delivered by global faculty (overseas faculty visiting India 4 times in a year)
- FRCEM Primary Examination and related preparation
- Preparation for English Language Proficiency Test (IELTS/OET)
- Clinical Audits – Introduction and Methodology
- Completion of Mandatory short courses- BLS, ACLS, PALS, ATLS
- Optional E – Learning Courses on Clinical Epidemiology and scientific and Scientific writing
- Focus on Work Life Balance and Community development programme

#### Year 2

- Enrolment in the MBA in Healthcare Leadership (MHCL)
- FRCEM Intermediate Examination and related preparation
- Clinical Audits- Application and real time audits
- Simulation Sessions – Communication skills, Dealing with difficult situations, System Based Resources
- At the end of year 2, candidates to finish their MHCL and complete MRCEM exam
- MRCEM OSCE Examination and related preparation
- Completion of Mandatory short courses- NRP, EM Sono, Course, Hospital Disaster Management
- Focus on Work Life Balance and Community Development Programmes



# UK

## Year 3 - 5

- 18 Months in a Secondary Care: clinical training and non-clinical training especially leadership skills at USW
- 18 Months in a Tertiary Centre: preparations towards FRCEM under educational supervisor
- FRCEM- Critical Appraisal Project or Quality improvement Project
- Subspecialty Training – Optional- USG, PEM, EMS, DM, Simulation etc

## Roles of Involved Institutions

### International Accredited Hospitals

- This Hospital will be the lead organization for the programme in India and responsible for the recruitment, the first 2 years of training and employment.
- The hospital will liaise with USW and BTA in UK and look after visiting UK trainers including their travel, lodging and boarding.

### University of South Wales

- This University will be UK organization participating in delivering MBA training as part of this programme.

### BAPIO Training Academy (BTA)

- BTA will be coordinating this programme in UK and link between India and UK.
- It will also be responsible for creating a UK visiting faculty and the UK consortium of Emergency Hospitals.
- It will coordinate with the faculty visits to India and organise UK induction and mentoring.
- It will provide pastoral care to ensure the wellbeing of Indian doctors whilst in the UK.

### Program Quality Assurance

- 360-degree feedback and real time intervention will be undertaken to safeguard the standard of the programme.
- The programme in India and the UK will be closely monitored and audited by experts deputed by the BAPIO Training Academy.

### Responsibilities of the UK Trusts

- Full support for planned education and training

### Participating Emergency Departments in India/ Overseas

- Emergency departments who elect to participate in this programme will acquire a senior to middle grade EM trainee.
- All the EM trainees should be provided with the opportunities the same as the UK EM trainees including study leave, annual assessments (akin to ARCP assessments) and support to sit the FRCEM examination.

**BAPIO Training Academy will support all trainees with their placement in the NHS hospitals subject to achievement of desired clinical and generic competencies which includes acquiring a set of skills, knowledge and attitude needed to work in the NHS and availability of vacant positions in the NHS.**
